## SCOUT SUNDAY

Each year on Feb. 8, the Boy Scouts of America celebrates its birthday. It's a date officially known as Scouting Anniversary Day.



But this is more than an excuse to eat an extra s'more and commemorate another year of Scouting adventures. It's also when packs, troops, crews and ships honor a Scout's "duty to God." The exact dates vary (see below), but each one is an opportunity for Scouts to publicly demonstrate the 12th point of the Scout Law: A Scout is Reverent.

That might mean an act as simple as wearing the full field uniform to worship services. It might mean participating in services by doing a reading, singing a song, or presenting religious emblems and awards to Scouts and Scouters. Or it might be something as grand as a service project to benefit a religious organization in the community. However you choose to celebrate, it's essential this year to do so safely.

According to the BSA's Calendar of Religious Observances .........

- Scout Sunday 2023 is Feb. 12, 2023
- Scout Shabbat 2023 is Feb. 10 and 11, 2023
- Scout Jumuah is Feb. 10, 2023

but units may adjust these date to best meet their needs.

The BSA's National Religious Relationships Committee has prepared this helpful Word document containing suggested services for an inter-religious celebration, an Islamic celebration, a Jewish celebration and a Christian celebration.





## National Fees Increase

The National Boy Scouts of America organization sets the fee amounts to register as a member of Scouting. BSA has increased the youth membership fee by \$3 effective August 1, 2022 in all programs except Exploring. Here are the new national fee amounts:

- \$75 for youth in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouting
- \$25 new member fee (one-time only, upon joining Scouting for the first time)
- \$45 for youth in Exploring
- \$45 for adult members in all programs (includes cost of background check) \$100 for a unit charter fee

The Council insurance fee of \$12 per person and Council Operations Fee of \$48 for youth and \$12 for adults will remain the same.

#### Note:

- Youth who cross over from Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA do not have to pay the new member fee
- Youth who transfer from one unit or program to another do not have to pay the new member fee
- Youth who are new members joining Exploring do not have to pay the new member fee

Adults who are new volunteers (in any program) do not have to pay the new member fee

#### WHAT IS WOOD BADGE?

Wood Badge training was started by Baden Powell in 1919 to ensure that the leaders of Scout troops were properly trained. Since then Wood Badge has been held worldwide, providing advanced leadership training to thousands of Scout leaders.

#### WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Wood Badge is designed to meet the advanced leadership needs of all Scouters, particularly unit level Scouters, such as Cub leaders. ## 2023 POMPERAUG DISTRICT PINEWOOD DERBY CHAMPIONSHIP

**Date:** Saturday, April 22, 2023. Race starts at 10 AM with check-in and weighing starting at 9 AM.

**Place:** St. Mark's School, 500 Wigwam Ln, Stratford CT 06614

**Registration Deadline:** All packs must be registered by April 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Entry Fee:** \$50.00 per Pack – Each Pack may enter 1 car per rank. If the top 2 racers in the Pack are from the same rank the Pack may enter 1 additional car. Cars entered should be the top cars from your Pack competitions. Substitutions may be made in case an entered Scout cannot attend.

**Includes:** Patches for all and trophies for top three finishers.

**The Races:** ALL cars will run multiple heats, in alternating lanes. Cars are assigned to heats randomly. Winner determined by shortest overall time.

**Rules:** A copy of the rules is attached. The rules may be slightly different than those used by an individual Pack. Cars that do not meet the specifications <u>will be not be allowed entry / disqualified</u>. We do not want to disappoint any Scouts so please read the attached rules carefully and MAKE SURE your cars meet the specifications. Any questions on the rules and specifications prior to the race can be directed to Seth Strohecker (203) 816-1683 or <u>seth.strohecker@gmail.com</u>

**Check-in:** All cars will be inspected at time of check-in. In the event of a problem with a car, the racer will have an opportunity to bring it into compliance (if possible). Once cars are checked in, there is no access to it until after the race. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the race committee is final. Cars and boxes should be marked with the Scout's name, Pack and rank.


**Attire:** All Scouts should be in class A uniforms. As always, BE PREPARED, attendees may be required to wear a face mask at all times and socially distance whenever possible.



# 2023 Pomperaug District Pinewood Derby Championship Rules

Precut bodies are not allowed. Nail axles, wheels, and body wood shall be from the approved BSA kit. Solid or "straight through" axles are not allowed. After-market, spoked, or modified wheels are not allowed. The kit wheels may be polished to remove the molding flashing, but the shape and side detail of the wheels may not be changed. Burrs or flashing on the nail axles may be removed.



- -Width of the car shall not exceed 2-3/4 inches.
- -Length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.
- -Maximum height of the car shall not exceed 3-3/4 inches.
- -Weight of the car shall not exceed 5.000 ounces.
   Weight may be added to the cars to reach
   5.000 ounces, but must be rigidly
   attached. No sliding weights or loose
   weights allowed.



- -The car must have at least 3/8 inches of ground clearance or it will not coast freely on the track.
- -The car must have at least 1- 3/4 inches inside clearance between wheels to fit on the track.

  The original block in the kit provides this dimension. If the wheels are too close together, they will rub on the track.
- -Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited.
- -The car shall not ride on any type of springs.
- -Any details added must be within the length, width, and weight limits.
- -The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices.
- -Dry graphite is the only lubrication permitted. Graphite must be applied before entering the race facility.
- -No loose materials of any kind are allowed in the car.
- -The car must be made during the current Pinewood Derby year.
- -Cars may not be modified after they have been accepted by the race stewards on race day. Repairs will be permitted only if there is damage that prevents racing.
- -No modifications to lead weights will be permitted in the facility.

HINT>:Don't play with the car too much before the races. Pinewood cars tend to get slower and slower the more they are used.
